

The implementation date for <u>California Assembly Bill 1215</u> (CA AB 1215) is **July 1, 2012**. CA AB 1215, among other things, prohibits a dealer from displaying or offering for sale a used vehicle unless the dealer first obtains a National Motor Vehicle Title Information System (NMVTIS) report. If the NMVTIS report indicates that the vehicle is or has been a junk or salvage automobile, or the vehicle has been reported as such by a junk or a salvage yard, or an insurance carrier, or the certificate of title contains a brand, then this information must be disclosed to consumers in advance of a sale.
